

Chisago County Republican Party
Resolutions from the February 6, 2018, Caucus
for Consideration at the March 1, 2018, Convention

1. Be it resolved that pro-Sharia-Law materials be removed from Minnesota Public Schools and any Islamic content be objectively evaluated and created independently of pro-Sharia-Law special interest groups.
2. Be it resolved that no special arrangements be made for any religions of any kind in school facilities for prayer times, etc.
3. Be it resolved that Minnesota legislators and school board officials bring their curriculum into compliance with the letter and spirit of Section 2, Article XIII of the Minnesota Constitution.
4. Be it resolved that the state pause all refugee resettlement until studies are conducted, completed, and a report made on the impact of such programs on city, county and state programs.
5. Be it resolved that only Founding Documents of this country and its legal system shall be recognized. No other legal system has status in this country including in a court of law.
6. Be it resolved that the Republican Party does not support Sanctuary Cities or States.

or

Be it resolved that the Republican Party opposes the existence of Sanctuary Cities and Sanctuary States.

7. Be it resolved that candidates and elected officials who represent the Republican Party should be held to high expectations of decency and professionalism in their conduct and speech.
8. Be it resolved that the Minnesota Anti-bullying Law (Safe and Supportive Schools Act) be amended so that it may NOT be used to teach that gender is fluid and not genetically fixed to biology, and that the anti-bullying law may NOT be used to implement transgender policies that have boys and girls using bathrooms, locker rooms, overnight facilities and participating in athletic teams according to their chosen gender identity as opposed to their biological sex.
9. Be it resolved that RPM supports students' rights to privacy and safety in school locker rooms, bathrooms, showers, overnight facilities, according to their chosen

gender identity as opposed to their biological sex. Be it further resolved that RPM supports student's rights to exercise their free speech by using pronouns associated with biological sex, and not be compelled to use language that makes a substantive statement about the nature of sex reality, in violation of the student's First Amendment right to free speech.

10. Be it resolved that parents may use vouchers for their children's education at schools of their choice equal to the amount spent per pupil in Minnesota public schools.
11. Be it resolved that the Minnesota Department of Education be held to the 14th Amendment of the United States Constitution and Article 1, Section 2 of the Minnesota Constitution by prohibiting schools from singling out a federally protected class of persons for belittlement or shame with the direct or indirect intent of providing special privileges to another federally protected class.
12. Be it resolved that our legislators and agencies hold spending on domestic programs to their allotted revenues, budget efficiently and reduce the level of fraud and waste.
13. Be it resolved that the Minnesota State Legislature shall join at least 33 other states in passing its Article V application (HF2690) which reads "Memorializing Congress to call a convention to propose amendments to the United States Constitution to (1) impose fiscal constraints on the federal government, (2) limit the power and jurisdiction of the federal government and (3) limit the terms of office for its officials and members of Congress."
14. Be it resolved the state should support strong, stable community-based services for people with disabilities and the staff who support them by setting spending and policy in order to promote independence and choice.
15. Be it resolved that we renew and strengthen the Minnesota Republican Party's public commitment to protect human life from conception to natural death by elevating that commitment to a section of the party platform rather than a subsection.
16. Be it resolved that the Republican Party of Minnesota support the creation and implementation of policies and legislation that oppose the expansion of government funding of the abortion pill.
17. Be it resolved that the Republican Party of Minnesota should oppose legalization of physician assisted suicide and should instead support healthcare solutions that prioritize real care rather than hasten death.

18. Be it resolved the Minnesota legislature develop an immediate statewide high-speed internet implementation plan, including major funding support for those rural areas of the state with development density barriers, so that private sector based affordable high-speed internet services can be acquired by all Minnesotans.
19. Be it resolved that all ballots be certified and counted that come from U.S. Military and citizens who are out of the country during elections, and those ballots be included in the total counts before county votes are reported to the state.
20. Be it resolved that we honor the First Amendment rights of free speech, but when that action becomes violent and illegal, those responsible be held liable for the cost of damages and destruction resulting from their actions, and they and/or their sponsors be required to pay for such costs and damages.
21. Be it resolved that no tax increase be permitted that exceeds the rate of inflation.
22. Be it resolved that the Republican Party support preserving our civil rights by enacting Stand Your Ground Legislation to protect individuals criminally and civilly by letting individuals protect themselves and their property without repercussions or double jeopardy.
23. Be it resolved that the Republican Party change its "Messaging and Unification Delivery" name and acronym. It is not beneficial to clarification and inspiration of the party. "Clear as MUD" is not beneficial to what the party is seeking to convey through this initiative.
